Six Bangor Students Selected for All-State Chorus





Is Easter Still Relevant?

Easter is the most important and sacred celebration for Christians. It marks the anniversary of Jesus' resurrection and ascension to heaven.

According to the New Testament, Jesus' death was His atonement for sin, and His resurrection represents the final and irrefutable proof that Jesus was the Son of God who had conquered death. It celebrates Christians' belief in the divinity of Jesus and the potential for salvation and renewal of faith.

Yet, is Easter relevant today? Can it... does it... impact our lives? I believe the answer is "yes" because Christ's resurrection is a rebirth - our rebirth, both on earth and in heaven.

To understand Easter's relevance today, we need to reflect on the meaning of Lent. Lent is a six-week period of fasting and abstinence. It is not intended to be gloom and doom, rather, a time of solemn reflection and observation.

Lent gives us hope that loss leads to something new. It invites us to make our minds and hearts ready for Jesus' life, death and resurrection.

Every year, as Easter approaches, I take the time to contemplate what is no longer working for me and examine a possible new direction (rebirth) for my life. I try to notice what feels stagnant, and what feels alive.

Just as we carefully prepare for events in our personal lives, like a wedding, a commencement or a birthday, Lent is a preparation - a time to recommit to our beliefs.

Easter is also relevant when we look within and go through our own restoration. Self-examination takes courage, and, if warranted, change. Life is movement, and we are all on a journey. We are all in this together.

As we look at the events of Holy Week leading up to Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection, we witness chaos and oppression - a time filled with fear, bigotry and anger. Jesus endured treachery and injustice.

Today, over 2,000 years later, these conditions still seem very real and present.

The world can seem like a dangerous place where truth and justice often appear to be on the losing side. It can be extremely difficult to have hope, because, unfortunately, hope can become weakened or even die.

Jesus preached and taught a message during His threeyear ministry that continues to resonate and influence our everyday living. He made himself known to us and gave us the confidence needed to face a hostile world.

Hope in God is the message we all need. Without hope we have no power to cope with life's inevitable setbacks. When things don't go the way we planned, we need to look to hope for the strength to keep going.

Biblical hope not only desires something good for the future — it expects it to happen and is confident that it will happen.

Present in our common humanity is compassion, love, joy, and the desire to serve and do good. Hope is something that should not waiver, because it is rooted in the faithfulness of God.

Enjoy Easter - color eggs, bake Easter bread and bunnyshaped cookies, go on Easter egg hunts, have fun with Easter games and crafts. Mostly, however, delight in the essence of Easter - believe in Hope, believe in Jesus and the joy of trusting in God.

shavees to participate. All proceeds will benefit St. Baldrick's Foundation in their fight against pediatric cancer. Donations are also being accepted for a tricky tray that will be held during the event.

"I have been overwhelmed with the generosity and kindness of our community and the amount of support from the

businesses involved," Miller said. "I feel as though this event has been a success before it [has even begun]!"

When someone commits to being a shavee, they are given their own fundraising page with St. Baldrick's. Donations can be made via the link or given to the shavee.

"I am shaving my head with the promise of maintaining my bald status for three months if I hit \$1,000 and keeping it an extra two weeks for every \$100 over my goal, or the event goal of \$5,000," Miller said.

First UMC Pastor Chris Hardy is also a shavee.

"I will be having my head shaved, as will my nine-yearold son, Gavin; we are Team Hardy," Pastor Hardy said. "Regardless if we would have reached our initial goal or not, we were going to have our heads shaved because, while the money is important, it is also a sign of solidarity and support for the children and their families going through cancer treatments."

Ms. Morris is also a community leader in other ways. She is active with the Historic Bangor Business Association, Bangor Economic Development Committee and Youth Engagement on Slate Belt Rising. In these roles Ms. Morris has worked to attract business to Downtown Bangor, and has also participated in the planning and execution of the Downtown Block Party. Ms. Morris is also the Committee Chair for the newly re-chartered Cub Scout Pack 102, which serves children in the Downtown area. Another passion of Ms. Morris is combatting human sex trafficking. In fact, Ms. Morris spent her honeymoon with her husband installing a floor as their 'honeymoon service project." Another organization that Ms. Morris is passionate about is VAST-Valley Against Sex Trafficking. She learned about the organization thru their community meetings. In addition, she worked with federal investigators and provided a training in 2018 regarding the correlation between Addiction and Sex trafficking.

Ms. Morris will be recognized at their annual fundraiser on May 16th, 2019 with their "Freedom Fighter" Award for her contribution and efforts towards awareness and outreach in VAST's mission and the larger movement to end human trafficking.




