Lance Prator, Mayor of Portland PA addressed the Bangor Women's Club at their February meeting at Prince of Peace Church. He described Portland's participation in the Scenic Wild Delaware River Project and the recreational benefits of GeoTourism. Portland information is listed on the DelawareRiver.NatGeotourism.com website. The walking bridge between Columbia. NJ and Portland, PA is part of the Liberty Water Gap Trail which goes from Delaware Water Gap to Liberty Park NJ; the National 911 Trail from Shanksville, PA to New York City; and Bike Route V. Local historians participated in entering the

information on the site. The group was instrumental in erecting a public restroom near the walking bridge thus the designation "Portland is the place to go". The area has a large amount of historic information and Lance encouraged everyone to tell their stories.

The club project this month was to fill purses with personal care items to be given to the Turning Point Shelter in Allentown. Ellen Prudenti and Judy Newcomb will deliver the items. Supporting domestic .violence shelters is one of the club's priorities. This month the club collected cash donations for PUMP Portland Upper Mt. Bethel Food Pantry. PUMP has a matching grant that will match all cash donations they receive. The craft group is starting a new project to sew bright colored cotton dresses for children in Haiti and knit woolen hats and scarves for Appalachia. The club collects calendars and greeting card fronts to donate to Slate Belt Nursing Home to use in their Occupational Therapy program. This month 15 calendars and 1808 card fronts were collected.

## **Waste Management Presents** Check to Slate Belt Rising

Waste Management's Grand Central

Landfill provided the first of its six-year commitment of funds to the Slate Belt Rising neighborhood revitalization initiative today. This is the first contribution for Slate Belt Rising.

Representatives from Waste Management presented a check for \$50,000 to the Slate Belt Rising Director Stephen Reider and members of the Slate Belt Rising Committee. In addition to the pledged funds by Waste Management and other corporate businesses, the program will receive money from state and local grants. Other corporate sponsors include Merchants Bank of Bangor, ESSA Bank and Trust and Lafayette Ambassador Bank. Among these corporate sponsors, a total of \$775,000 has been pledged to support this project. The Slate Belt Rising will be the state's first multi-municipal Neighborhood Partnership Program (NPP). I look forward to working together with them and making this Slate Belt revitalization effort a success," said Reider.

## Time Running Out to Claim \$1 Billion in Tax Refunds from 2013

Taxpayers who did not file a tax return for 2013 may be one of the nearly 1 million who may be due a refund from that year. Taxpayers must claim their part of almost \$1 billion by this year's April 18 tax deadline. To claim a refund, taxpayers must file a 2013 federal income tax return. Here are some facts about unclaimed refunds:

The unclaimed refunds apply to people who did not file a federal income tax return for 2013. The IRS estimates that half the potential refunds are more than \$763. Some people, such as students and part-time workers, may not have filed because they had too little income to require them to file a tax return. They may have a refund waiting if they had taxes withheld from their wages or made quarterly estimated payments. A refund could also apply if they qualify for certain tax credits, such as the Earned Income Tax Credit

The law generally provides a three-year window to claim a tax refund. For 2013 returns, the window closes on April 18, 2017.

The law requires that taxpayers properly address, mail and postmark their tax returns by April 18, 2017, to claim their refund.

After three years, unclaimed refunds become property of the U.S. Treasury. There is no penalty for filing a late return if taxpayers are due a refund.

The IRS may hold 2013 refunds if taxpayers have not filed tax returns for 2014 and 2015. The U.S. Treasury will apply the refund to any federal or state tax owed. Refunds may also be held to offset unpaid child support or past due federal debts such as student loans.

Taxpayers who are missing Forms W-2, 1098, 1099 or 5498 for prior years should ask for copies from employers, banks or other payers. Taxpayers unable to get these copies can request a wage and income transcript either online or by mail. Taxpayers can also file Form 4506-T to get a transcript.

The three-year window also usually applies to a refund from an amended return. In general, you must file Form 1040X, Amended U.S. Individual Income Tax Return, within three years from the date you filed your original tax return. You can also file it within two years from the date you paid the tax, if that date is later than the three-year rule. That means the deadline for most people to amend their 2013 tax return and claim a refund will expire on April 18, 2017.

2 doses of Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) (1st dose after 1st birthday)

3 doses of Hepatitis B (Hep B)

2 doses of Varicella Vaccine or written statement from parent or physician that the child has had Chicken-Pox

In order to determine school building assignment, parents will be asked to inform the school district where their child will be picked up for school and where he/she will be dropped off.

Upon completion and return of the registration packet, parents/and or quardians will be given a date and time for a screening appointment. Kindergarten screenings for the 2017-2018 school year will occur

## 3 Ways Soapstone Enhances Home Design



(Family Features) Move over, marble and granite. There's a new, old stone that's coming back into vogue. After first coming into use 5,000 years ago, soapstone is once again becoming a "go-to" material for kitchen and bath designs, indoor and outdoor living

spaces and more.

There are three primary reasons for the revived interest in soapstone, according to Steven Schrenk, digital media director and design consultant at Polycor, who has been working with natural stone for 22 years.

Aesthetics: One major factor driving soapstone's appeal is shifting aesthetic trends. While designers and homeowners have been fascinated by the bright, wide range of colors and bold patterns that could be discovered in natural stone, people are coming back to a tonal, more muted palette, according to Schrenk.

Schrenk sees more designers working with textures within a similar palette of color and playing up the tactile qualities of materials and patterns within that limited palette.

"This is where soapstone plays well in pairing with these different finishes," he said. "It tends to blend into its space and become more integrated in the whole design instead of being a separate, individual entity."

Another aesthetic benefit of soapstone is that multiple tonalities can be achieved depending on the finishing techniques.

"It may be a cool, blue-gray color when left in its natural honed state or a deep, sultry black when waxed or enhanced," Schrenk said. "You



Turning 50 brings some fantastic benefits. AARP will mail you a shiny new membership card. Then your primary care physician will tell you it's time for a shingles shot, mammogram and, drum roll please, a colonoscopy.

The word alone can make people shiver. And then there's the preparation. The amount and taste of the cleansing solution you drink the day before are the stuff of urban legend.

With all that to look forward to, it's no wonder people put off having a colonoscopy. But they shouldn't. According to the American Cancer Society, 1 in 20 people will develop colon cancer. The U.S. Centers for Disease Control estimates that 60 percent colorectal cancer deaths could be prevented.

An some fairly common factors can increase your risk for colon cancer, like smoking, obesity, alcohol use and an inactive lifestyle.

So if you have been putting off your colonoscopy, here's what you can do to make the preparation safer and more bearable.

#### **FOLLOW DIRECTIONS**

The day before the procedure, you will not eat solid foods. Instead you will drink "clear" liquids. Clear in this case means water, broth, soda, coffee, tea, some juices, popsicles and even Jell-O. Just avoid red dyes.

## **AVOID CERTAIN CLEANSING METHODS**

According to gastroenterologist Lindsey Van der Veer, MD, a member of the medical staff at Easton Hospital, some cleansing methods can cause other problems.

"Even as patients consume large amounts of liquid during preparation, they can become dehydrated," he says. "Our goal is to keep patients hydrated and maintain a healthy electrolyte balance."

#### **ASK FOR OPTIONS**

There are three preparations that Van der Veer offers.

"Patients shouldn't think there is just one option," he says. "Their gastroenterologist just needs to get creative and offer other preparations."

Balanced Electrolyte Solutions: Products like NuLytely, CoLyte or TriLyte are the most common options. You drink four liters on the evening before the procedure — one glass every 15-20 minutes. Using a straw can help with the taste.

"The amount can be a deterrent to patients," says Van der Veer. "But they will stay hydrated, maintain electrolytes and avoid kidney issues."

Suprep: You get to drink less with this option. Instead of four liters, patients drink six ounces mixed with 10 ounces of water. They then follow it with two more 16-ounce glasses of water. They repeat this process twice.

'While there is less to drink, the taste is much sweeter," he says.

Miralax: While this option is not approved by the FDA, it is commonly used. Patients mix Miralax with 64-ounces of a clear liquid like ginger ale or Gatorade and then drink a glass every 15 minutes until the container is empty.

"Patients like that they can drink less and mix it with various liquids," he says. "But the lack of FDA approval can dissuade some individuals."

Regardless of the preparation you decide on, one of these options should help make preparing for a colonoscopy less dreadful. Once you pick the best option for you, it's time to fill your glass and toast your new life as a 50-year-old. Bottoms up!



## **April the Giraffe Watched by Millions**

Who would have thought a pregnant giraffe would become an overnight sensation? That is exactly what has happened as millions worldwide watch the live stream and videos of "April" the pregnant giraffe. April currently resides at the Animal Adventure Park petting zoo in upstate New York, where her keepers keep a close eye on her pregnancy and health. Fifteen-year-old April is now over sixteen months pregnant. What Photo: BBC News makes her pregnancy so special are the

updates on how much the baby is moving, especially since baby giraffes at birth are six and a half feet tall and weigh about two-hundred and twenty pounds. With each new video, her stomach moves more and the anticipation and excitement grow as tens of thousands wait on the edge

of their seats for April to deliver her calf. With all the excitement, we can't leave out daddy "Oliver," who is referred to as April's "baby daddy." He is only five years old, and he gets monitored visits with April. They monitor these visits because he may injure her due to how pregnant she is. Male giraffes are generally not part of the calf raising process, however, Oliver seems to be guite taken with April and watches over her. Another reason that April the giraffe is so intriguing to her viewers, is that her species is endangered. Giraffes have become endangered due to habitat loss and poaching. Unfortunately, this has gone unnoticed due to the slow progression of them dying out. If you're interested in seeing what all the fuss is about, you can watch her amazing journey, by live stream videos and prepare for the birth of her calf!
