





SUMMER BUMMERS

Summer is in full swing and we are enjoying being outside in the heat. Picnics, camping, the beach, and fun in the sun is much of what we think about when it's summer. We don't tend to think of the bad that comes with summer until it actually happens. No matter how much we try to prevent summer aches and pains and annoyances, they happen. Sunburn, bug bites, jellyfish stings, insect bites and stings, food poisoning and hangovers. Here are a couple natural remedies to help.

Sunburn- Sometimes we just forget to reapply sunscreen or apply it at all. It has happened to all of us. Using real aloe gel from an aloe leaf is one of the best ways to help soothe the skin. Luckily aloe plants are being sold everywhere as well as the individual leaf at grocery stores. Keep one on hand for occasions like this. Cut a small section of the aloe leaf and take the green skin off. You will be left with just the slimy inner fillet. Use this inner fillet and spread it all over sunburned skin. Discard at each use. Apply a couple times a day for relief. You'll be amazed at how quickly this helps sunburned skin. Another good thing to have on hand is milk of magnesia. Use it on sunburned skin and leave overnight. It will leave skin white but works great.

Jellyfish stings- Thankfully this is a very rare thing to happen but it's good to be aware of what to do. Instead of rinsing your sting with water, which can reactivate the stinging cells, use vinegar after you remove the tentacles. The acetic acid lessens the pain by deactivating the release of venom from the jellyfish tentacles.

Spider bites- make an activated charcoal poultice for spider bites and stings from mosquitos, fire ants, bees, wasps and yellow jackets. Mix 1/2 teaspoon of activated charcoal with 1 Tablespoon water. Apply to a bandage and place on affected area. Leave on for 2-4 hours or until dry. Change out as often as you need to. The poultice will reduce swelling and inflammation from the bites and stings.

Food poisoning and hangovers-these are two very different ailments but I placed them together because both can be alleviated with activated charcoal. Activated charcoal absorbs toxins and help alleviate some of the symptoms of food poisoning. Take 2-3 capsules 3 to 4 times a day when having food poisoning. Take 2 capsules after drinking alcohol or 2-3 capsules for hangovers. Remember to drink extra water and if possible electrolyte drink. Always consult your doctor especially when there is food or alcohol poisoning.
